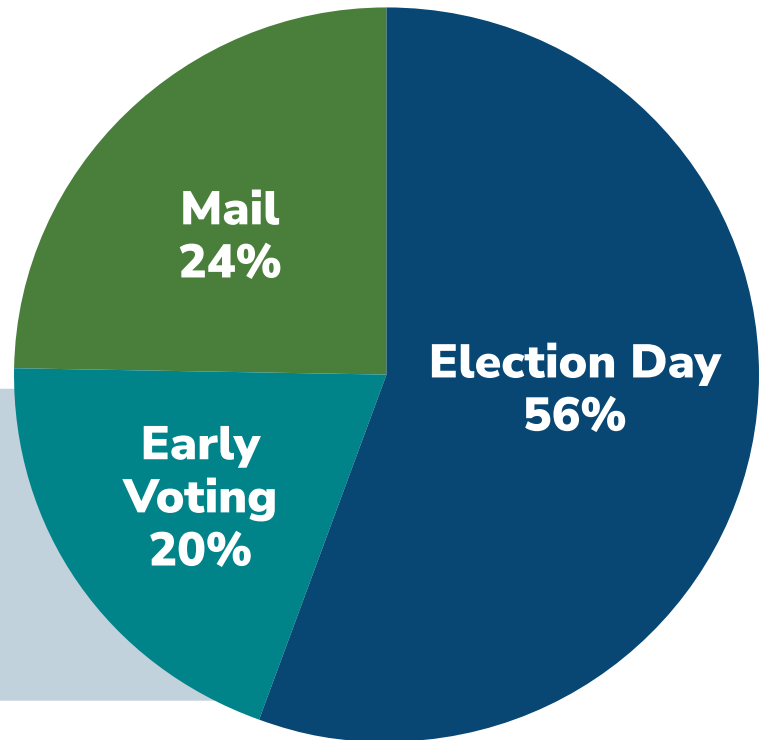
Voter Turnout & Method

Democratic Party Primary

14% of active voters participated in the Democratic Party Primary for U.S. House of Representatives, 8th District and County Board (1 seat).

Total Democratic Ballots Cast: 23,622

- Election Day: 13,176 (includes provisionals)
- Early Voting: 4,658
- Mail: 5,788 (includes post-election)

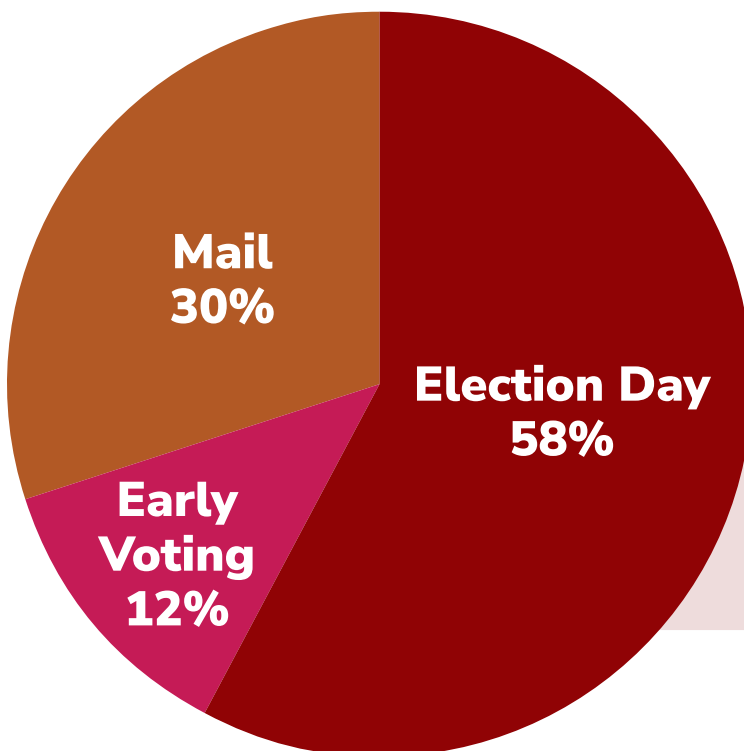


Republican Party Primary

Total Republican Ballots Cast: 1,890

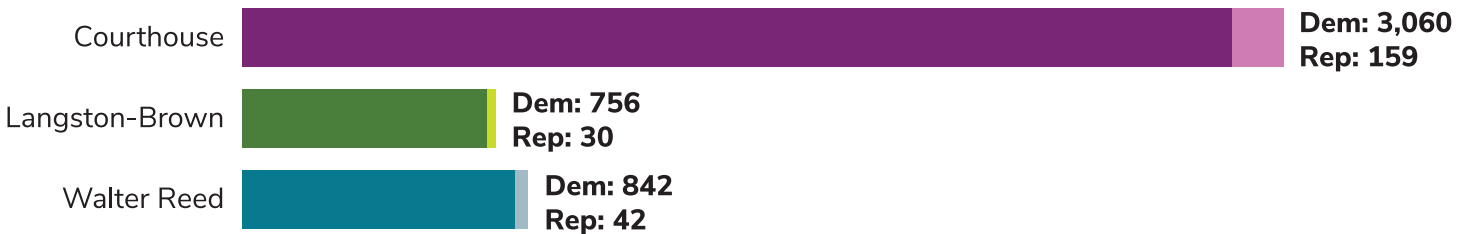
- Election Day: 1,092 (includes provisionals)

Early Voting Turnout by Site

Three Early Voting sites were available this election. Courthouse Plaza was open weekdays from June 18 through July 31, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., with additional hours on Sunday, July 19, Sunday, July 26, Saturday, July 25, and Saturday, August 1.

Two satellite sites, at the Langston-Brown and Walter Reed Community Centers, were open on Sunday, July 19, Saturday, July 25, Sunday, July 26, Friday, July 31 and Saturday, August 1.
