BACKGROUND

The Arlington Office of Voter Registration & Elections will be conducting the first election in Virginia using ranked choice voting for the 2023 Democratic Primary for the office of County Board. While other party-run nomination events have been held in Virginia; this is the first time an office will conduct an election using ranked choice voting adhering to all the requirements in Virginia code section 24.2. Based on previous primaries, we anticipate voter turnout will be around 25,000.

What is Ranked Choice Voting:

Ranked choice voting (RCV) is a voting method in which voters rank candidates in order of preference (1st choice, 2nd choice, 3rd choice). Ranked choice voting allows your vote to count towards another candidate if your 1st choice candidate is eliminated. For example, if your 1st choice candidate is eliminated, your vote is transferred to your 2nd choice candidate. If your 2nd choice candidate is eliminated, your vote is then transferred to your 3rd choice candidate.

- Voter Registration Deadline: May 30, 2023
- Deadline to request a Mail Ballot: June 9, 2023, 5pm
- Election Day: June 20, 2023



OUTREACH & EDUCATION GOALS

Our goal is to inform voters, candidates, and the election community about implementing ranked choice voting in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

In order to best inform voters, candidates, and the election community about implementing ranked choice voting, this Ranked Choice Voting Outreach and Education Plan will aim to:

- **No. 01** Provide detailed information about voting an RCV ballot, so voters are prepared when marking their ballots during the election.
- **No. 02** Provide information on the background and benefits of RCV and why Arlington has adopted this method of voting.
- **No. 03** Provide detailed information about the tabulation process of RCV and when results will be reported.
- **No. 04** Ensure community outreach partners are trained and have the tools needed to educate the public about the use of ranked choice voting in Arlington County.
